Still have questions about making the transition to a Wildlife Management Valuation?

Here are three frequently asked questions landowners have asked when it comes to making the first step in converting from an Ag or Timber tax valuation.

What are the requirements to qualify for a Wildlife Management valuation?

To qualify, your land must already have an Ag or Timber valuation. A detailed Wildlife Management Plan must also be submitted to your county appraisal district by April 30th.

 Will my property taxes increase if I switch from Ag or Timber to Wildlife Management?

No, switching to Wildlife Management maintains your special valuation status, so your property taxes would remain the same as they were under Ag or Timber. The key difference is that instead of agricultural production or timber harvesting, you'll be managing the land to support native wildlife.

What kind of activities count toward Wildlife Management qualification?

There are seven approved activity categories, including habitat control, predator control, providing supplemental food or water, and more. You must engage in at least three of these activities annually.
